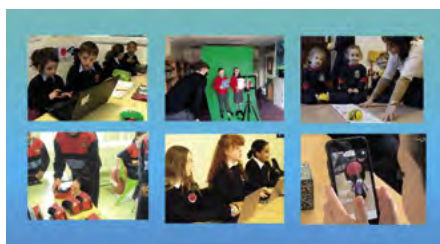


New filtering tool

To filter search results, complete the following steps:

1. Go to the website: pdsttie.ie.
2. Click **Courses & Practice**.
3. Click **Good Practice Videos**.
4. In the left pane, from the **Categories** menu, select one of the following:
